

KILLEHUSET

According to the records kept by the local clergyman who visited rural households to ensure that everyone learnt his/her catechism properly, this cottage was named after the well or spring, "källa" in Swedish, down by the edge of the wood.

Later it came to be known as "Anton Jönsson's", after the last cottager. The cottage was built in 1827. The first cottager, Nils Pålsson, lived here until 1840 with his wife Johanna and their daughter Maria. The last family arrived from Kvärk in 1944. They were Anton Jönsson, a tenant farmer, his wife Ellen Alfrida, and their daughters. The family moved down to Skärälid in 1957. The cottage was let as a summer-house from 1960 to 1989. Nowadays it forms part of the Söderåsen ("Southern Ridge") National Park.
